

DEPUTY CHAIRMAN OF THE CITY ASSEMBLY OF NIŠ

Mr. Vladica Maričić

Mr. Maričić was born on March 12th, 1987, in Niš, where he finished "Branko Miljković" Primary School (2002) and "Bora Stanković" Grammar School (2006). He graduated from the Faculty of Law, the University of Niš on March 23rd, 2011, with the grade point average of 9.45, as the best graduate student in the generation. On November 12th, 2013, he defended his Honors thesis "Stability and growth pact, opportunities and limitations". He finished his Master's studies with the grade point average of 9.86, and received the Best Student Award of the Faculty of Law, the University of Niš, which was given by the City of Niš at the proposal of the Faculty.

Throughout his studies at the university, he was a member of the Student Parliament at the Faculty of Law, an editor of the student magazine "Pravnik", Secretary of the Student Parliament of the University of Niš and a representative of students in several bodies of the University of Niš.

He is the Secretary of the Academy of Technical-Educational Vocational Studies, where he has been working since May, 2023. During the period from 2013 to 2016, he worked on administrative-legal affairs in the process of attaining the beneficiary's right to financial social assistance at the "Sveti Sava" Centre for Social Work, Niš; during the period from 2016 to 2017, he worked at Niš City Council on administrative-legal affairs and on preparation and implementation of its sessions.

During the period from 2020 to 2022, he was a Member of Parliament in the 12th convocation of the National Assembly of the Republic of Serbia; from 2020 to 2022, he was Secretary of the Assembly of the City Municipality of Medijana; from 2017 to 2020, he was Chairman of the Governing Board of the "Sveti Sava" Centre for Social Work, Niš.

In 2023, the Government of the Republic of Serbia appointed him representative of the originators of the University Board of Niš.

In 2012, he was elected councilor of the City Assembly of Niš, as well as in 2024.

He has been a member of the Serbian Progressive Party since 2008.
